Air Liquide Korea carries out Clean day activity

On July 24, Air Liquide Korea carried out a 'Clean Day' event at Geumodo Island in Yeosu, Jeollanam-do, one of the large-scale operations sites for Air Liquide Korea. Jointly organized with the Local Sustainability Alliance of Yeosu and Korea Federation for Environmental Movement Yeosu (KFEM), the event was part of Air Liquide Korea's corporate social responsibility program 'Act for a Clean and Safe Community'.

During the half-day event, Air Liquide Korea employees worked to raise awareness on the environmental protection campaign among local residents, as well as on the cleaning of the beaches of Geumodo in Dadohaehaesang National Park. More than 100 volunteers, including Air Liquide employees, joined this effort.

The event was the fourth Clean Day organized by Air Liquide Korea. The Clean Day activities are devised to protect the environment and enhance proximity with local communities. Additional Clean Day programs will be carried out near other Air Liquide Korea branches this year as part of the company's 'Act for a Clean and Safe Community' program.

One key focus of the event was the protection of the endangered Korean Finless Porpoise Sanggwaengi. The porpoises living in the southwest seas of Korea are designated as an 'endangered' and vulnerable species under the 'Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES)'. They are considered to be **under threat of extinction** due to aggressive coastal development and fishing.

Christopher Clark, Air Liquide Korea CEO, commented: "We are honored to participate in raising awareness to protect this endangered species. It is our pleasure to assist the Korean Federation for Environmental Movement Yeosu and the Local Sustainability Alliance of Yeosu. Efforts such as these are fully in line with our support for a cleaner and safer environment."
